

Student submission of video assessments

An overview of the process



- 1. You set up a Blackboard Assignment
 - and ensure students can't access their grades immediately
- 2. You provide the students with details of the assessment
 - Who will provide technical support for students who need it?
- 3. Students create and submit their videos
 - By following special instructions and using Kaltura
- 4. You use the Grade Centre to view and grade
 - and optionally provide feedback
- 5. The grades are released to the students


Blackboard Assignments



- See the <u>online help pages</u>
- Is this an individual or group assignment?
 - if group then you will need to set up the groups first
 - for small cohorts, manual enrolment is OK
 - for larger cohorts, you can import a special data file
- Have you considered using a grading rubric?
- Group assignment + individual submission
 - you will need to create two assignments
- IMPORTANT: You MUST hide the assignment grades









Hiding the grades in Grade Centre




 You must do this or students will see their grade as soon as you mark their assignment.

 You must make the grades visible once making and moderation have been completed.




Students create and submit videos



- Min/max length? Landscape or portrait?
- Direct to camera presentation or visuals with voiceover?
 - a mix of the two requires video editing software and skills
- Group videos are a technical challenge
 - group members narrate separate slides in a shared file
 - make a recording of a webinar presentation
- Be very clear about the assessment criteria
 - use a rubric?
 - show examples from previous cohorts?



Final step: check your video plays






Marking video assignments



- Use the Blackboard Grade Centre
 - Needs Marking
- Select the assignment
- View the video
- Mark using a rubric
 - OPTION: adjust marks for each criterion
 - OPTION: add typed criterion feedback if desired
- Provide overall feedback as text and/or a file
 - Type a mark or OPTION: adjust calculated mark from rubric












Grading criteria and adjusting points







Complete marking using the rubric






Releasing grades to the students



- 1. Access the Full Grade Centre
- 2. Locate the assignment's column
- 3. Click its **Options** button
- 4. Select Hide grade from students (on/off)
- 5. Check you can't see the 'hidden' symbol

This symbol shows the grades are hidden
